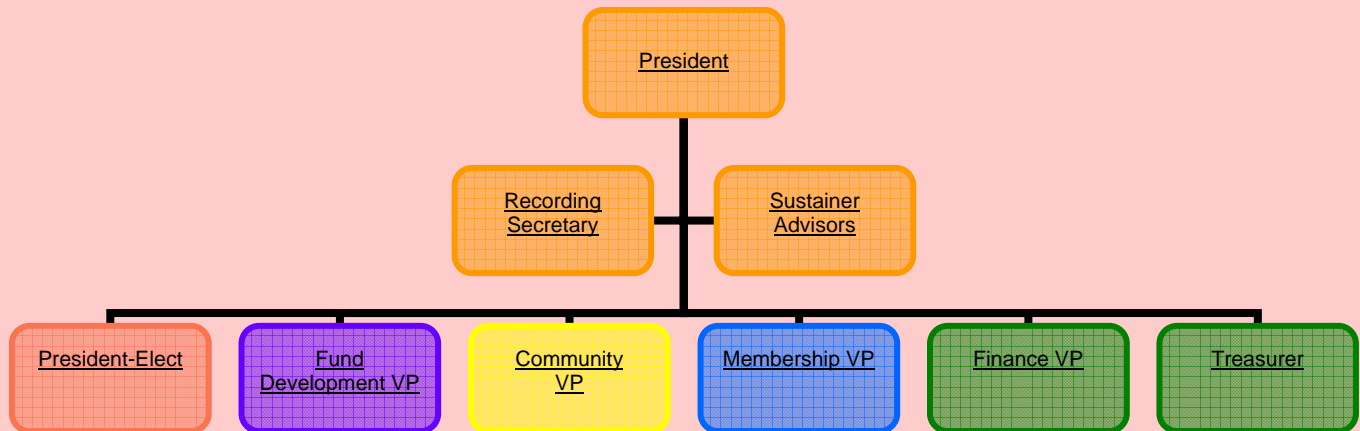
2009-2010 JLFW Board of Directors

VSA hours are a helpful tool in tracking member hours to use when applying for grants, sponsorship dollars, awards, and as a measuring tool for setting goals. Awards are also distributed at the Annual Dinner.

Members who log at least 100 hours achieve the Bronze level award, 250 hours earns a Silver level award, and at 500 hours you will receive the Gold level AJLI President's Volunteer Service Award.

All of the volunteer hours you have contributed since April 1, 2008 can be counted towards the 2008-2009 Junior League year.

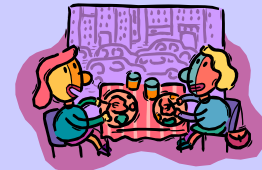

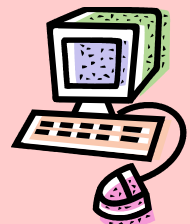

Community Impact Committee News

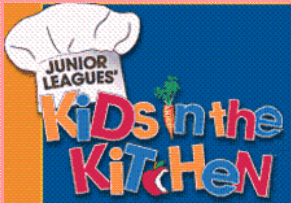

In 1919 a small group of high school women created a charter for the E. Jane Hamilton Society and dedicated their efforts to community projects. In 1941, this group applied for and was accepted as a member of the Association of the Junior Leagues of America, forming the Junior League of Fort Wayne. This News-Sentinel photo from the Junior League archives was captioned:

The Fort Wayne women laughed at the cold winds as they snuggled into their rich furs, estimated to be worth \$5,760. A skit spoofing the E. Jane Hamilton Society (and the Junior League of Fort Wayne which later it became), originally presented in the 1960s, was recreated by Carol Bennett and Betsy Chapman for the evening. Also, Sustainers presented the inaugural E. Jane Hamilton Award for Outstanding Community Service to 60 year League member, Joyce Eberly. Nearly 90 members and friends attended.

The Sustainers are hopeful that the event will become an annual tradition of fun and friendship for all members of JLFW.

THE E. JANE HAMILTON AWARD

We are pleased to share with you the words of wisdom Joyce Eberly eloquently spoke at the Sustainer/Active Social on September 14 at the Fort Wayne Country Club.

Joyce is the first recipient of the E. Jane Hamilton Outstanding Community Service Award.

Congratulations Joyce!

“Thank you all for coming tonight. I am honored to be the first recipient of the E. Jane Hamilton Award. I also am humbled, not only by the award, but also by how old I am. I was shocked to realize that I knew 14 of the 18 women pictured on this wonderful invitation!

I have been a member of the Junior League for just a mere 60 years. I have learned so much during my Provisional and Active years. Tonight I would like to share a few of these things with you.

The first lesson I learned was to carefully select my projects. My criteria for becoming involved in a project are:

- I must have a genuine interest in a project.
- I must plan to devote time working on the project, and...
- I am prepared to make a financial donation, if needed.

For example, I am currently assisting with Ivy Tech's capital campaign, which has met all of my criteria. It's a wonderful place with a very dynamic chancellor who is fun to work with, plus Ivy Tech fills a critical need in our educational system.

My second League lesson taught me the importance of performing due diligence. For example, at a National Junior League meeting, Tracie Martin learned about a center for grieving children and their families. Our League performed due diligence by assessing our area's need for such a service. As a result, in October of 1993, Erin's House for Grieving Children began. I was delighted to serve on the original board. Today there are six Junior League members on the Erin's House Board, including me! Thousands of children and their families have been helped over the years.

Third, personal credibility is of utmost importance. In 1971, a need was identified for a facility to teach pre-school deaf children. I was on the school board and learned that FWCS was not permitted to build such a facility but could accept one that was donated. FWCS gave us the land next to Brentwood School. Then Danny Latz, Carolyn Gutman and I relied on our personal credibility to secure all in-kind donations. Upon completion of the building, we turned it over to FWCS. It is still being used to teach deaf children and other special needs students. In fact, I visited the school two weeks ago.

My next lesson was that even though I am a great lover of e-mail, I learned the importance and effectiveness, at times, of personal phone calls. For example, I am currently working on a fundraising dinner for Matthew 25. One afternoon I sat down and made phone calls, asking people to be table captains. In two hours I had commitments for over half of the tables. I have learned that it is more difficult to say “NO” to a person than it is to an e-mail.

Another thing I've learned is that volunteering is really fun. I've gotten to meet and know new people of all ages and to learn more about our community. I couldn't have done any of the projects I've mentioned without the help of friends and acquaintances, including so many League members.

In conclusion, I understand the demands made on women today and that volunteering is not always easy, but it is needed for a strong community and for personal development.

I could go on with many more stories about what Junior League has taught me...but I think you've heard enough. Thank you again for the honor you have given me tonight, and thank you for coming.”

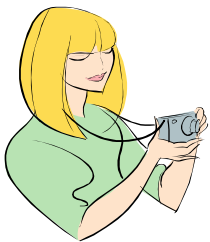

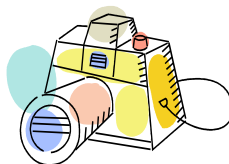
