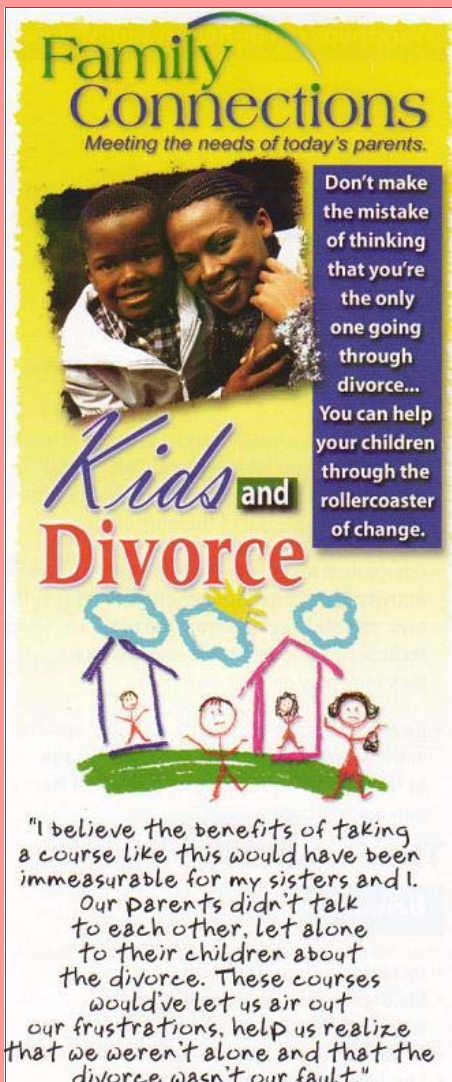

PROMOTING VOLUNTARISM



As many of you know, JLFW's partnership with Family Connections is in its final year before we relinquish the daily responsibilities of the program to SCAN. This year we have focused our efforts on marketing to educate more people about the Kids and Divorce classes available in our community.

Our committee began our marketing push by writing and sending a letter to introduce the classes to all of the guidance counselors at Fort Wayne Community Elementary Schools. We followed up by contacting each school and each guidance counselor to make sure they received the packet we mailed to them, as well as to ask questions such as: Would this type of program benefit the children in your schools? and How could we partner with you to educate your parents about Family Connections?

Through our follow up we discovered many schools were interested. One guidance counselor suggested that we contact the Director of Guidance Counselors for Fort Wayne Community Schools to see if we could present at a mandatory meeting for all Guidance Counselors in December. After our due diligence, we were able to confirm 30 minutes to present information about the Kids and Divorce classes at their meeting.

During our presentation, we were able to educate all of the guidance counselors, answer questions about the program, and leave brochures for them to take for their schools. We had nine guidance counselors raise their hand to say that this program is needed in their school. Please be on the lookout for an increase in the number of classes, opportunities to facilitate, and number of kids impacted as the project grows in 2008!

If you are interested in impacting a child's life and helping them through a difficult time, this is an outstanding opportunity for you to become a facilitator. Facilitating a class also counts to fulfill an elective on your menu of commitments.

As a reminder, in order to become a facilitator, you must complete the following steps:

1. Sign up for an orientation class (contact Katie Lancia)
2. Complete a criminal background check (provided by Family Connections)
3. Observe a Kids and Divorce Class (this step is optional for those who feel comfortable facilitating without first observing a class)
4. Facilitate with a seasoned facilitator

There are always two facilitators for each class. If you are interested in becoming a facilitator, please contact Katie Lancia for more details at oshaugka@hotmail.com.

The Details

- It will be a three year partnership with Hope House and Women's Bureau Transitions Program.
- JLFW will research, develop and facilitate employment skills workshops designed to increase the ability of the women in these programs to find and maintain employment and reach the ultimate goal of self-sufficiency.
- JLFW will work with local businesses to create a database of businesses willing to employ Hope House and Transitions residents who are recovering from drug addictions.
- JLFW will develop and possibly pilot a mentoring program for Hope House women.
- JLFW will help Hope House research and evaluate a potential social enterprise. The social enterprise would be a small business providing training and job opportunities for the women of Hope House, as well as income for Hope House.
- Hope House and Transitions will educate JLFW volunteers about issues associated with addiction and homelessness which may make this population unique.



The Impact on the Community

- Increase employment opportunities for approximately 90 previously homeless, addicted women participating in the Hope House and Transitions programs annually.
- Children of addicted parents are at the greatest risk of repeating their parent's life choices. By improving these women's self-esteem and enabling them to become self-sufficient, the cycle of addiction may be broken.
- Develop the potential of the women in these programs by teaching them life and employment skills otherwise unavailable to them.

The Impact on JLFW

- Members will have the opportunity to positively affect women and their children's lives with hands-on involvement in the project at multiple levels.
- Members will develop their research and workshop facilitation skills.
- Members will have the opportunity to participate in the classes for their own development.
- Visibility of JLFW will be enhanced through the project, its impact, and our ability to bring organizations together for collaboration.

Upcoming Deadlines for Opportunities to Partner with JLFW

The Junior League of Fort Wayne is currently accepting Applications for Partnership for Community Opportunity Grants and Done-In-A-Day (DIAD) Projects.

Community Opportunity Grants are grants of up to \$2000 available to local not-for-profit agencies with programming complementing the JLFW Mission and/or focus area of improving the lives of women and children. Applications must be for program funding rather than general operating expenses and are due on January 31, 2008.

Through Done-In-A-Day Projects, community organizations can request a group of JLFW volunteers for a specific one or two day special project or for a one-time need of extra volunteers. Project applications that are selected will receive volunteers and may receive funding and/or supplies. Typical projects can be completed by ten or fewer volunteers in one day or less, working 2-4 hour shifts. Organizations JLFW partners with for DIAD projects typically have programming that complements the JLFW Mission and/or focus area of improving the lives of women and children. Applications for DIAD projects will be accepted through February 1, 2008 for projects to be completed by May 31, 2008.

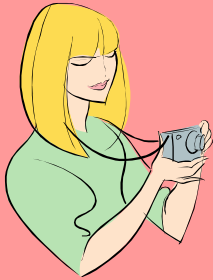

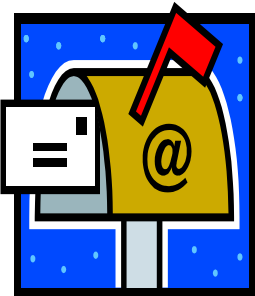
